General Instructions about application for BARTI-DELHI-CET-2017

1. Online application form is available on our website <https://barti.maharashtra.gov.in> under Notice Board on link **BARTI-DELHI-CET-2017- APPLY ONLINE**.

2. **Eligibility:** Scheduled Caste (SC) candidate of Maharashtra State who is Graduate in any Discipline as on 1st December, 2015 and eligible to appear in UPSC (Civil Services) Examination- 2017

Note: The candidate, who has already availed the benefits of sponsorship by BARTI to Prestigious Coaching Institute in Delhi, for the coaching of UPSC (Civil Services) Examination, is not eligible to apply.

3. Candidates have to apply by filling the application form online, **on or before 8th January, 2016.**

4. While filling the online application form, candidate should take care of particulars like correct name, birth date, e-mail id, mobile number, address, selection of BARTI-DELHI-CET- 2017 Exam Centre, etc.

5. Candidate can apply only once with one valid e-mail id only. If any candidate applies more than once, then the first application will only be considered and the remaining application will be rejected.

6. **BARTI-DELHI-CET-2017 Examination will be conducted at Pune, Nagpur and Aurangabad.** Candidates have to select any one exam centre at the time of filling the application form. No request for change in exam centre will be entertained after submission of application form.

7. Selected candidates will be sponsored to prestigious coaching institutes in Delhi, for free coaching of UPSC (Civil Services) Examination-2017. List of empanelled coaching institute in Delhi, will be uploaded on BARTI's website at the time of declaration of the result of BARTI-DELHI- CET- 2017.

The decision for choice of coaching institute in Delhi, from the list of empanelled coaching institute by BARTI, has to be taken by candidate only. However, BARTI Decision will be final.

8. **Online e-Admit Card** will be available on BARTI's web site, under the link name **BARTI-DELHI-CET-2017-ADMIT CARD, on or after 18th January, 2016.** Venue of Examination Centre, Date and timing of examination will be mentioned in Admit Card only. Candidates will not be communicated by any other mode of communication.

The Pattern of Question Paper for BARTI-DELHI-CET-2017

1) **Examination** will be conducted in **two sessions**. Question Paper is divided into **two papers, Paper –I (General Studies) and Paper – II (CSAT) of 200 marks each (total 400 marks).**

2) Examination of **Paper I (General Studies)** will be conducted in **first session, from 10.30 A.M. to 12.30 P.M.** and Examination of **Paper II (Civil Services Aptitude Test - CSAT)** will be conducted in **second session from 02.00 P.M. to 04.00 P.M.**

3) Question paper will be made available in both **English and Hindi** languages as UPSC (Civil Services) Preliminary Examination.

Selection Procedure:

1. It is mandatory for every candidate to appear for both the Papers {Paper – I (GS) and Paper – II (CSAT)} of BARTI- DELHI-CET- 2017. Any candidate who does not appear in both the papers WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED FOR SELECTION.
2. Top 125 candidates will be selected for the coaching of UPSC (Civil Services) Examination – 2017, at prestigious coaching institutes in Delhi. The number may increase or decrease. The final merit will be decided on the basis of total marks obtained by the candidate in both the papers {Paper – I (GS) and Paper – II (CSAT)} of BARTI- DELHI-CET- 2017.
3. While selecting candidates, for the coaching of UPSC (Civil Services) examination- 2017, at prestigious coaching institutes in Delhi, 30% of total seats will be reserved for Women Candidates and 3% of total seats will be reserved for Disabled candidates.
4. First merit list of the selected candidates will be uploaded on our website <https://barti.maharashtra.gov.in>.
5. Second merit list will be declared only if the selected candidate in first merit list does not take admission till the last date for admission declared by BARTI, Pune.

6. Selected candidates will be required to e-mail scan copy of the following documents on cecbarti@gmail.com, and bring the original documents for verification at BARTI, Pune or at any other place as may be notified by BARTI, failure to which the candidature of the candidates will not be considered.

The required documents are as follows:

1. SSC certificate or Date of Birth Certificate
2. Certificate of Graduation
3. Caste Certificate
4. Caste Validity Certificate
5. Income Certificate of parents (income from all the sources)
6. Domicile Certificate
7. Copy of admit card for BARTI-DELHI-CET-2017
8. In case the candidate is employed, his/ her Income Certificate

7. Selected candidates, who are willing to take admission for the coaching of UPSC (Civil Services) Examination – 2017, at prestigious coaching institutes in Delhi, will have to sign and submit to BARTI, Pune, an undertaking on Rs 100 stamp paper and will have to abide by the terms and conditions of BARTI, Pune, mentioned in the undertaking.

8. Selected candidates will have to join coaching in prestigious institute in Delhi, as allocated by BARTI, Pune to the candidate, in the month of June / July, 2016.

9. BARTI may conduct a **Free Foundation Course** at Pune or any other place for those who will be selected in BARTI- DELHI- CET- 2017. The foundation course will be aimed to guide the candidates in selecting the optional subject and the coaching institute. Attending the foundation course will be mandatory for the selected candidates. All the expenses including lodging, boarding, etc for this course will be borne by BARTI.

Facilities

Facilities for candidates selected by BARTI-DELHI-CET-2017, for Free Coaching of UPSC (Civil Services) Examination - 2017 at prestigious coaching institutes in Delhi

1. Coaching fee to be charged (about Rs 2 lakh) by the prestigious institutes in Delhi will, be paid by BARTI.
2. Rs. 12,000 /- p.m. stipend will be paid to each candidate for boarding, lodging, etc. in Delhi.
3. Each candidate will be paid one time grant of Rs. 5000/- for onward journey to Delhi and Rs. 5000/- for return journey, after completion of coaching.

4. BARTI may conduct a Foundation Course for those who will be selected in BARTI-DELHI-CET-2017. Representatives of the coaching institutes and BARTI's experts will guide the candidates in detail. It will also contain excellent coaching on Communication Skills, Spoken English, Soft Skill, Personality Development, etc. All the expenses including lodging, boarding, etc for this course will be borne by BARTI.
