General Instructions about application for BARTI-DELHI-CET-2018

1. Online application form is available on our website <https://barti.maharashtra.gov.in> under Notice Board on link **BARTI-DELHI-CET-2018- APPLY ONLINE**.

2. **Eligibility:** Scheduled Caste (SC) candidate of Maharashtra State who is Graduate in any Discipline as on 1st July, 2017 and eligible to appear in UPSC (Civil Services) Examination-2018

Note: The candidate, who has already availed the benefits of sponsorship by BARTI to following schemes for the coaching of UPSC (Civil Services) Examination, is not eligible to apply.

- 1. Residential Program in Maharashtra- Pune, Nagpur and Aurangabad (In the year 2015-16)**
- 2. UPSC Training in YASHADA and SIAC (Pre IAS Center) (In the year 2016, 2017)**
- 3. Prestigious coaching institute in Delhi (In the year 2015, 2016)**

3. Candidates have to apply by filling the application form online, **on or before 17th June, 2017.**

4. While filling the online application form, candidate should take care of particulars like correct name, birth date, e-mail id, mobile number, Aadhar number, address, selection of BARTI-DELHI-CET- 2018 Exam Centre, etc.

5. Candidate can apply only once with one valid e-mail id only. If any candidate applies more than once, then the first application will only be considered and the remaining application will be rejected.

6. **BARTI-DELHI-CET-2018 Examination will be conducted at any city in six revenue division (Pune, Nagpur, Nashik, Mumbai, Amravati and Aurangabad).** Candidates have to select any one exam centre at the time of filling the application form. No request for change in exam centre will be entertained after submission of application form.

7. Selected candidates will be sponsored to prestigious coaching institutes in Delhi, for free coaching of UPSC (Civil Services) Examination-2018.

8. **Online e-Admit Card** will be available on BARTI's web site, under the link name **BARTI-DELHI-CET-2018-ADMIT CARD, from 20th to 24th June, 2017.** Venue of Examination Centre, Date and timing of examination will be mentioned in Admit Card only. Candidates will not be communicated by any other mode of communication.

9. BARTI reserves the right to amend intake capacity, nature and duration of the training program at any time.

The Pattern of Question Paper for BARTI-DELHI-CET-2018 Exam

1) **Examination** will be conducted in **two sessions**. Question Paper is divided into **two papers, Paper –I (General Studies) and Paper – II (CSAT) of 100 marks each (total 200 marks).**

2) Question paper will be made available in both **English and Hindi** languages as UPSC (Civil Services) Preliminary Examination.

Brief description of the question paper is as follows:

Selection Procedure:

1. It is mandatory for every candidate to appear for both the Papers {Paper – I (GS) and Paper – II (CSAT)} of BARTI- DELHI-CET- 2018. Any candidate who does not appear in both the papers WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED FOR SELECTION.
2. Top 100 candidates will be selected for the coaching of UPSC (Civil Services) Examination – 2018, to prestigious coaching institutes in Delhi. The final merit will be decided on the basis of total marks obtained by the candidate in both the papers {Paper – I (GS) and Paper – II (CSAT)} of BARTI- DELHI-CET- 2018.
3. In case if two or more candidates are scoring similar marks, BARTI reserves the right to decide the eligibility criteria for the selection of students.
4. While selecting candidates, for the coaching of UPSC (Civil Services) examination- 2018, at prestigious coaching institutes in Delhi, 30% of total seats will be reserved for Women Candidates and 3% of total seats will be reserved for Disabled candidates.
5. First merit list of the selected candidates will be uploaded on our website <https://barti.maharashtra.gov.in>.
6. Second merit list will be declared only if the selected candidate in first merit list does not take admission till the last date for admission declared by BARTI, Pune.

7. Selected candidates will be required to e-mail scan copy of the following documents on competitiveupsc@barti.in, and bring the original documents for verification at BARTI, Pune or at any other place as may be notified by BARTI, failure to which the candidature of the candidates will not be considered.

NOTE: In case of Handicapped candidates, they should present their certificate of disability at the time of examination and to the respective coaching centre before the commencement of the coaching.

The required documents are as follows:

1. SSC certificate or Date of Birth Certificate
2. Certificate of Graduation
3. Caste Certificate
4. Caste Validity Certificate
5. Income Certificate of parents (income from all the sources)
6. Domicile Certificate
7. Copy of admit card for BARTI-DELHI-CET-2018
8. In case the candidate is employed, his/ her Income Certificate
9. Aadhar card (UID)/ PAN Card
10. Two Passport size photograph

7. Selected candidates, who are willing to take admission for the coaching of UPSC (Civil Services) Examination – 2018, at prestigious coaching institutes in Delhi, will have to sign and submit to BARTI, Pune, an undertaking on **Rs 500 stamp paper** and will have to abide by the terms and conditions of BARTI, Pune, mentioned in the undertaking.

8. Selected candidates will have to join coaching in prestigious institute in Delhi, as allocated by BARTI, Pune to the candidate, in the month of July, 2017.

Facilities

Facilities for candidates selected by BARTI-DELHI-CET-2018, for Free Coaching of UPSC (Civil Services) Examination - 2018 at prestigious coaching institutes in Delhi

1. Coaching fee to be charged (about Rs 2 lakh) by the prestigious institutes in Delhi will, be paid by BARTI.
2. Rs. 12,000 /- p.m. stipend will be paid to each candidate for boarding, lodging, etc. in Delhi.
3. Each candidate will be paid one time grant of Rs. 5000/- for onward journey to Delhi and Rs. 5000/- for return journey, after completion of coaching.
